

The **National Federation of Music Clubs** American Music Month named the Harmonia Music Association, Lebanon, PA the first place winner. A concert about the Gershwins, Ira and George, was presented Saturday, November 5, 2022 at St. Luke's Episcopal Church Auditorium, Lebanon, PA and earned that honor. The music was organized by the concert Chairman, Gary Cohen, and a narration about the lives of the brothers was researched and written by Pat Walter, then Secretary of the organization.

Soloists were Lee Moyer, keyboard and vocals, then President of the Club. April Pelegrini, Mezzo-Soprano; Michael Welch, Tenor soloist; and Katherine Hoopes, Violin soloist, are all Harmonia Members. Lisa Herzing, Soprano soloist; St. Luke's choir member, Bob Philips, baritone soloist and Lebanon County Commissioner, represented the community. Accompanying the soloists were Gary Cohen and Rebecca Duke, both Harmonia members. A variety of solos and duets were presented with all the singers performing together for a final piece. The highlight of the program was a stirring performance of the Rhapsody in Blue piano solo by the Chairman, Gary Cohen.

The Woman's Club of Lebanon furnished refreshments after the affair. Donations over \$700 were received for Harmonia's Scholarship Fund. Two \$2,000 scholarships are awarded annually by Harmonia to Lebanon County graduating seniors who will be active in music in college. The **NFMC** monetary award of \$300.00 will be applied to the Scholarship Fund.

Harmonia Music Association of Lebanon County opened their 2023-2024 Season on Saturday, November 11 at 3:00 P.M. Handel's Messiah Sing-In was held in Miller Chapel at Lebanon Valley College. The College Music Department joined Harmonia in presenting this event. Pat Walter, Harmonia President, opened the afternoon with a welcome and explained that the event supported Harmonia's Scholarship Fund. All musician's services were gifts as was the venue. Any monies donated went directly to scholarships.

Dr. Mark Mecham, retired chair of the LVC Music Department, directed and Shelly Moorman-Stahlman, currently a professor of music at the College, was the organist. Soloists were: Jessica Weidman, Soprano; Amy Yovanovich, Mezzo/Alto; Jonathan Walker-VanKuren, Tenor; Jason Widney, Bass/Baritone; and Christopher Campbell, Trumpet. A chorus of 50 volunteer musicians was led by Dr. Mecham in an inspirational afternoon presenting a large part of this magnificent work.

MUSICAL ART SOCIETY

Our club, Musical Art Society, continues to see a loss of members, but we did gain 2 new members recently. As of this date, our club currently has 29 members. We have been trying to collaborate with several musical organizations in the Lancaster area but so far have not had any success. We are looking to collaborate with other musical organizations to work under the umbrella of Musical Art Society as a way to raise money for our organization and bring in new members.

We held Festivals this year on March 18, 2023 in Lancaster, PA with a total of of 32 students, 4 events, and 3 Junior Studios participating. There were 25 Superior Ratings given. **NFMC** has started a new online Festivals program called Vivace. All the student information is entered online with the student's performance history and number of points toward gold cups.

Musical Art Society gave five Memorial Awards to five students this year. The Schock Memorial Award in the amount of \$600.00 was divided into two awards of \$300.00 each which was awarded to Carly Gilbert, Oboe; and Emma Zdrojewski, Flute. The Sauer Memorial Award in the amount of \$300.00 was divided into two awards of \$150.00 each which was awarded to Victoria Mitchel, cello; and Jaden Espenshade, Piano. The Hillegass Memorial Award in the amount of \$500.00 was awarded to Sean Skinner, Piano.

For our 2022-2023 season, we have a variety of programs planned as follows:

November 19, 2023 – "String Chamber Music" featuring club member, John Hamilton, and his string students. This program is dedicated to NFMC "Crusade For Strings."

December 10, 2023 – "Holiday Mosaics" featuring the students of the Workshop For Young Performing Artists, which is sponsored by Musical Art Society.

Our community outreach continues with our "Music For A Summer Night" concert series, which will be held at Bachman Center, 633 Community Way, Lancaster, PA at 7:30 p.m. are planned as follows: June 11, 2024 featuring the students of the Workshop For Young Performing Artists and our 2024 Memorial Award Winners; and June 25, 2024, featuring Gary Peters and the Rohrerstown Band, performing our annual patriotic program.



NATIONAL MUSIC WEEK

American Music Month was celebrated by the Harmonia Music Association with two events. The Annual Banquet on Tuesday, May 9, 2023 included performances by the two Lebanon County seniors who were awarded \$2000 each from Harmonia's Scholarship Fund. Jack Liedka, Annville High School, presented snare drum solos both a cappella and accompanied by the Scholarship Co-Chairman, Mark Dimick. Sophia Medzoyan, Cornwall-Lebanon School District performed a clarinet solo accompanied by her teacher and Harmonia Member, Wayne Fox.

Another highlight of the evening was the Induction Ceremony for the new nominees for the Lebanon County Musicians Hall of Fame. Inducted during this 11th induction ceremony were: Mark Dimick, organist, choir director, Harmonia member and co-chairman of the Scholarship Committee; Anthony Gerace, Sr., presented posthumously - jazz woodwind player, educator and private teacher; Carole Haines, Flautist, performing locally and along the east coast; Robert Meashey, jazz trumpet and college professor; Amy Jo Rhine, French Horn principal orchestra player and private teacher; Eric Schweingruber, trumpet, Philadelphia Orchestra member; Sherie Strohman, woodwind player, educator, private teacher and HS school band drill writer; and JD Walter, professional jazz singer, educator and private teacher both nationally and overseas.

Ruth Ann Mc Chesney, **NFMC** Board member, **NFMC** Northeast Region Vice-President and **PFMC** Past President installed the new Officers: Patricia Walter, President; Heather Buffington, Vice President; Rebecca Duke, Recording Secretary; Kathy Thrapp, Corresponding Secretary; Katherine Hoopes, Federation Secretary; and Stephany Houser, Treasurer.

The second event during National Music Week, A Choral Gala, presented on Saturday, 13 May 2023 included a variety of choral groups each performing a portion of the program held at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, Lebanon. Sally Miller-Checket, Past Harmonia President, was the chairman of the event and directed the entire ensemble in a final piece, "God Gave Us Music", by Dale Wood. Performing groups included: A Cappella Eight directed by Ken Horst; The Chancel Choir from Holy Trinity Lutheran Church directed by PJ Copenhaver; Manor Men from Cornwall Manor Continuing Care Facility directed by Pat Walter; the Psalm Ringers Handbell Choir directed by Heather Buffington; Michael Kitchen and his Gospel Singers; and the choral group from Cadence Institute, a newly formed music organization directed by Michael Welch.

The featured group was the 5th Avenue Falcons, a nationally recognized elementary choir from South Lebanon Elementary School in the Cornwall Lebanon School District directed by music teacher Shawn Small. It was noted that Shawn Small was a former Harmonia scholarship winner in 1997. Donations for Harmonia's Scholarship Fund amounted to nearly \$500. Both events were submitted to the **PFMC National Music Week** Chairman, and the Choral Gala to PFMC's Choral Music Chairman and Sacred Music Chairman.
