TO ALL VOTING MEMBERS OF PFMC

Qualifications for voting:

- 1. Members of the Board of Directors, all Individual Members and elected delegates from organizations holding Active membership in the Senior and Student/Collegiate Divisions; and one Counselor from each active organization in the Junior Division.
- 2. Each Active Senior organization is entitled to delegate representation based on paid membership, 25 member or less-1;26-50 members-2. An additional delegate per each 50 members not to exceed 6.
- 3. Each active Student/Collegiate organization 1
- 4. Each active Junior organization 1 adult delegate
- 5. No proxy or absentee voting will be permitted. Only one vote per person.
- 6. One-half plus 1 of qualified voters shall constitute a quorum. (Approved April 6, 2019)

PFMC BY-LAWS

The **PFMC** By-Laws are reviewed periodically by a **PFMC** Board committee. Any recommended revisions by the committee are distributed for review with discussion scheduled for the next Board meeting. The most recent recommendations will be distributed by the **PFMC** President and will be posted on the **PFMC** website. COMPETITIONS AND AWARDS

The National Federation of Music Clubs (NFMC) offers more than \$750,000 in competition and award prizes on the Local, State and National level. The Biennial Young Artist and Ellis Duo-Pianists competitions award a total of \$92,000 in awards and two years of performance bookings. Additional competitions are sponsored by the Federation in a wide range of categories, including voice, instrumental music, composition, dance, conducting, handicapped and visually impaired, and music therapy. NFMC also sponsors more than 38 annual and biennial awards for students desiring to attend the 20 sponsored Summer Music Centers.

For the next three years the service was held at St. Paul's Lutheran Church and in 1941 was moved to First United Methodist Church where it remained until 2014. From then to the present, Pine Street United Methodist Church has been its home. During the earlier years we fondly remember Miss Eva Buck's cornet introduction to the first hymn.

Mrs. John R. Kauffman, III, ringing her swiss bells, our own string ensemble, and three vocal ensembles: Juvenile, Junior (Student) and Senior – all of which appeared regularly to capacity audiences.

It is interesting to note that our last remaining charter member, Dorothy Jacobs Streeter died in 2012, 75 years after she capably served as chairperson of the very first service. Also, Mary Landon Russell, another charter member and well known and beloved pianist and teacher who died in 2008, played numerous times at services throughout the years. Our oldest living member, Jane Keyte Landon has served many times so well as piano soloist or accompanist, too.

Traditionally the free will offering at this service was given to a local charity which this year is our local American Rescue Workers. Over \$1400 was generously given this year.

It consisted of a beautiful piano organ duet, organ solos, piano solos, vocal solos, flute solo, choral ensemble, audience carol singing, handbells, and a time of each attendee holding a lit candle as they sang Silent Night to guitar accompaniment.
